

## New mega college has practical vision

THREE of Port Elizabeth's top technical colleges merged earlier this

year to from a mega Further Educa-tion and Training (FET) centre. Bethelsdorp Technical College, Iqhayiya College and Russell Road College combined to form the Port Elizabeth College. The new college has five campuses, located across the city in Central, Struandale and the Northern Areas. Pre- to postmatric courses are offered.

According to Willa Durant, co-

ordinator of Corporate Affairs at the PE College, the emphasis has changed slightly and the colleges will now be looking more towards pre-matric, while at the same time still focusing on higher education.

"Students will be able to concen-trate less on academics and more on the practical side, as each course has practical components," she said.
